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Reference List

The Bible and Other Religious Books (10.2.35)

Format: *Religious Work Title*. (Republished Year). Title of Website or Title of Publication Company. [if website] <https://URL> (Original work published [year])

Example: *The Book of Mormon*. (2013). The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. (Original work published 1830)

The Family: A Proclamation to the World (10.1.15)

Format: Alphabetize using “family” (see 9.49)
The family: A proclamation to the world. (1995, November). *Ensign*, 25(10), p. 102.

General Conference Talks and *Ensign* Articles

Format: Author, A. A. (Year, Month, Day). Title of article. *Magazine*, Vol(Issue), pp-pp. URL

Example: Cook, Q. L. (2014, November). Choose wisely. *Ensign*, 44(11), 55-57. <https://www.churchofjesuschrist.org/study/general-conference/2014/10/choose-wisely?lang=eng>

Personal Communications, Lectures, and Interviews

Format: No citation in the reference list necessary

Encyclopedias/Dictionary

Format: Organization. (Year). Term. In *Title*. Retrieved date, from URL

Example: Merriam-Webster. (n.d.). Joy. In *Merriam-Webster.com dictionary*. Retrieved May 7, 2019, from <https://www.marriam-webster.com>

Presentation Slides and Lecture notes

Format: Author, A. A. (Year). *Presentation title* [Format]. Name of Learning Management System. URL

Example: Adams, J. (2016). *Brainstorming tactics* [PowerPoint slides]. Learning Suite@BYU. <http://learningsuite.byu.edu>

YouTube Videos

Format: YouTuber, A. A. [Screen name]. (Year, month day). *Title of video file* [Format]. YouTube. URL

Example: Olan Rogers [OlanRogers]. (2012, February 16). *Ghost in the stalls* [Video]. YouTube.

TED Talk

Format: Author, A. A. (Year, Month, Day). *Title in sentence case* [Video]. TED Conferences. URL

Example: Giertz, S. (2018, April). *Why you should make useless things* [Video]. TED Conferences. https://www.ted.com/talks/simone_giertz_why_you_should_make_useless_things?language=en
